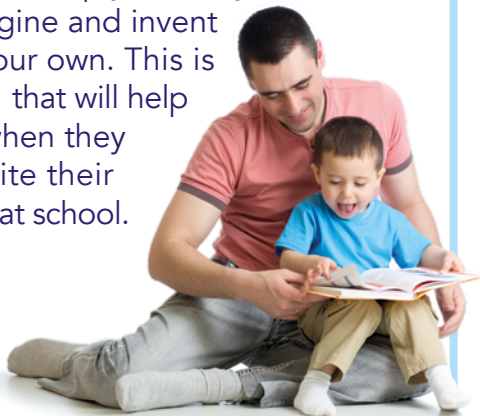


Just imagine what it would be like to be as small as a mouse or as big as a house. Imagine exploring the depths of the ocean, travelling into the past or the future – or something even stranger...

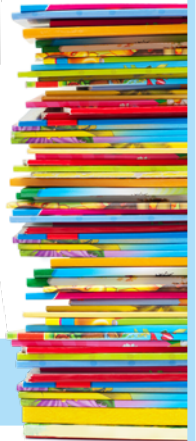
Treasure your Imagination Library books.
