

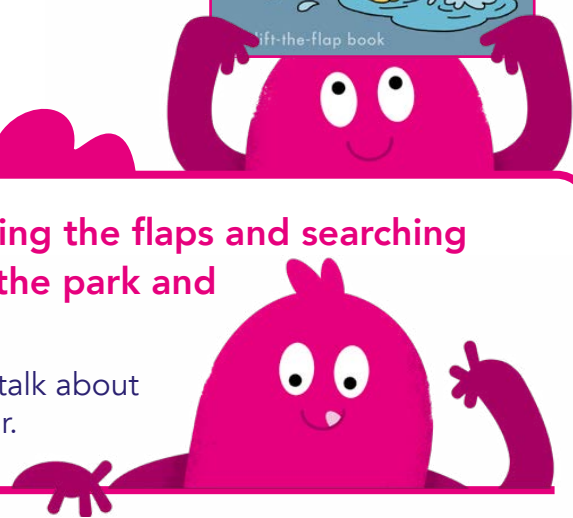
FIND SPOT - THE RAINY DAY

Your child can enjoy lifting the flaps and searching for Spot in the woods, the park and the farm.

Use the page at the back to talk about the different types of weather.



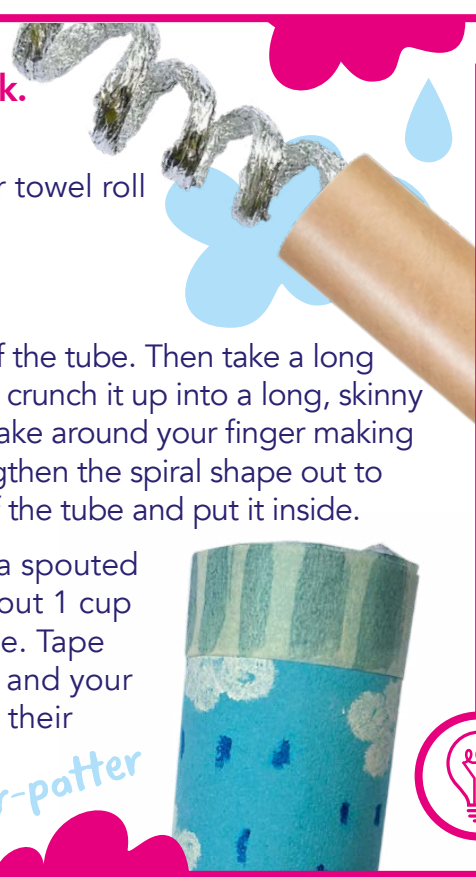
Make a rain stick.

You will need:

- An empty paper towel roll
- some tin foil
- packaging tape
- a cup of rice

Tape up one end of the tube. Then take a long piece of tin foil and crunch it up into a long, skinny snake. Wrap the snake around your finger making a spiral shape. Lengthen the spiral shape out to about the length of the tube and put it inside.

Using a funnel, or a spouted container, pour about 1 cup of rice into the tube. Tape the open end shut and your child can decorate their finished rain stick!
