Hampshire CAMHS

Hampshire Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services [CAMHS](#) is an NHS specialist service that supports young people aged 5-18 years and their families who are experiencing difficulties with their mental and emotional health.

Key services include:

- **assessment and treatment:** CAMHS provides comprehensive assessments and tailored treatment plans for a range of mental health issues, including anxiety, depression and behavioural problems
- **crisis support:** immediate support for young people in mental health crises, ensuring they receive timely and appropriate care
- **therapeutic interventions:** various therapeutic approaches, such as cognitive-behavioural therapy (CBT), family therapy and group therapy

Anna Freud National Centre for Children and Families

[Anna Freud National Centre for Children and Families](#) supports the mental health of children through research, training and treatment and offers free resources supporting children's mental health. They also offer two free professional networks: [Early Years in Mind](#) and [Schools in Mind](#).

Beacon House

[Beacon House](#) is a therapeutic service with a specialist interest in working with those who have experienced trauma and loss and offers information and resources around the impact and repair of trauma and adversity.

Adoption & Special Guardian Support Fund

The adoption and special guardian support fund (ASGSF) provides funds to local authorities and regional adoption agencies (RAAs) to pay for essential therapeutic services to support adoption/care related needs for eligible adoptive, special guardianship order (SGO) and child arrangement order (CAO) families.

Parents and Guardians can seek ASGSF funding via their supporting social care team such as Adopt South or the Family Connections Service.
