- To encourage those children and young people to express their views, wishes and feelings
- To take into account the views, wishes and feelings of those children and young people
- To help those children and young people gain access to, and make the best use of, services provided by the local authority and its relevant partners
- To promote high aspirations, and seek to secure the best outcomes, for those children and young people
- For those children and young people to be safe, and for stability in their home lives, relationships and education or work; and
- To prepare those children and young people for adulthood and independent living

Championing Kinship Care: The National Kinship Care Strategy

• In February 2023, DfE published Stable Homes, Built on Love to respond to the Independent Review of Children's Social Care.

Kinship Care

• In December 2023, DfE published Championing Kinship Care. Government has invested £20m of funding in 2024-25 to ensure there is well designed improvement across the kinship care sector so that kinship carers and children in kinship care arrangements feel supported, empowered, and heard.

• As part of this, £3.8 million in 2024-25 to expand the role of Virtual School Heads to ensure that more children in kinship care receive the help they need to thrive at school

Pupil Premium Alert for Autumn 2024

Virtual School data shows us that there are a large number of Hampshire schools who are not in receipt of the Previously Looked After Child Pupil Premium Plus (PP+). This is most apparent for pupils in the current Year 7, and for some in Year 3.

We need your assistance to ensure that every child is correctly recorded on the October 2024 Census

Primary DTs

Ensure that PLAC status is discussed as part of your transition meetings for your current Year 2 and Year 6 pupils.

Encourage **parents** to raise this with the new school, and to check on Census day that their child's PLAC status has been recorded correctly.

Check that new Year 3 pupils are recorded on the census if parents/guardians are in agreement

Alert your School Admin team.

Keep up the conversations with parents

Secondary DTs

Check with your Transitions team/lead to see if PLAC status is recorded on the school admission form.

Check that parents are happy for their child to be recorded on the Census.

Check that your School Admin Team are aware of new incoming Year 7 children with PLAC status.

Check that they are recorded on the census.

Keep up the conversations with parents

Know that parents are likely to call to check that their child has been recorded as PLAC

Primary and Secondary DTs

You may have children in older year groups who have been omitted in previous years. Consider an item in your school newsletter to ask for parents to talk with you if they feel that their child meets the PLAC criteria.



Example for your school newsletter:

Previously Looked After Children

If your child was previously in the care of a Local Authority and is Adopted, has a Special Guardianship Order, Residence Order or a Child Arrangement Order we may be able to attract some additional pupil premium funding to support their educational needs in school. If you feel that your child meets this criteria, please make contact with *Mxx Xxxxx*, our Designated Teacher, to arrange a time to talk. Any information that you can share regarding your child will be treated confidentially.
